



## Teachers Resources - Environmental Crime – Fly Tipping – Answers and suggestions

### Age 10-11 group – Activity 1 - Witness Forms

#### Examples:

- D Countryside, forest, lots of trees, car park nearby
- D Slim, medium height, long brown hair, female
- D Black bags, half full
- D Day time, sunny, possibly spring or summer
- D Dumped bags of rubbish over the fence into the wooded area

### Questions prior to the start of video 2 – Age 10-11 group Activity 2

#### Examples:

1. Where was she at 7.15 in the morning?
2. What car does she drive?
3. What colour is her car?
4. What is her car registration number?
5. Where does she live?
6. Where does she dispose of her rubbish?

### Answers for activities following Video 2

#### Age 10-11 group – Activity 3 Interview questions – Used or not?

Score 1 point for each questions that they have written down that the Enforcement Officer used in the interview.

Score and extra 2 points per question if they have a questions that would be useful that the Enforcement Officer did not use.

#### Age 10-11 group – Activity 4 Fly Tipping Discussion

1. The driver should take her waste to the nearest refuse and recycling centre

#### Examples:

- Railway Terrace, Loughborough
  - Hathern Road, Shepshed
  - Granite Way, Mountsorrel
2. Ask where they take their waste, could be all recycled at kerbside, taken to the refuse and recycling centre.
  3. The nearest refuse and recycling centres in Charnwood are;
    - a. Railway Terrace, Loughborough
    - b. Hathern Road, Shepshed
    - c. Granite Way, Mountsorrel
  4. Wildlife and humans could be affected by fly tips. Dispersed litter from fly tips can also affect sea animals/mammals/fish. Score 1 points for each correct answer if completed as a quiz.
  5. The Council would clear up after a fly tip if it was on Council owned land or the highway but if it was dumped on the highway it would be the land owner that has to clear the fly tip. Score an extra 5 points if they knew about private land owners if completed as a quiz.
  6. Ask them about the rubbish, what it was, where it was and how it made them feel.



**Answers for Activities following Video 3**

**Age 10-11 group – Activity 5 Newspaper front page**

The template provided should be used to create a newspaper front page that covers the offence and or the court case. They could draw pictures or add quotes from the Enforcement Officer in the larger boxes.

**They could add an imaginative heading.**
